**PARK RULES**

Open - May 15 to October 15  
Office is Open 11am - 5pm.  
Camp Host Located at Site #46

1. Check-out time is NOON.
2. Check-in time is 3:00 pm.
3. Campers must back onto site pads - Do not drive across the grass.
4. Quiet time is from 10:00 pm to 9:00 am. No running of generators during quiet time.
5. No dishwashing in restrooms.
6. Campfires in fire rings only.
7. No fires tied to trees.
8. No vehicles or RV washing in campground.
9. No fish cleaning in park. Use fish cleaning station at boat launch east of campground.
10. All garbage must be bagged and placed in dumpster, not in fire rings!
11. Dumpster is for disposal of household garbage ONLY. Do not dispose of large items in or around dumpster. Additional fees will be charged for large items.
12. Please DO NOT FEED geese, seagulls or ducks.
13. Children are to be supervised at all times. Under 8 years of age must be accompanied by an adult to the restrooms and showers.
14. Do not dump GRAY WATER on the ground.
15. Limit one camping unit and one tent per site, or two tents per site. Reservations include 2 adults and 2 children. Additional persons will be charged \$2.00 per person, per day.
16. Do not remove backflow preventer from water faucets.
17. No smoking in restrooms or office.
18. Alcohol to be consumed on campsite only.
19. Fall payment due upon reservation.
20. See Reservation and Cancellation Policy to the right.

\*May have fewer amenities during extended camping season.

**Failure to comply with the above rules and city ordinances can result in immediate removal from the property without refund.**

**PETS**

- Pets must be on a leash at all times.
- You must clean up after your pet. Place droppings in a bag and dispose into garbage receptacle, not in fire rings.
- Do not leave pets unattended. Dogs left alone inside campers tend to bark.
- Do not tie pets to trees.
- Keep pets inside at night.
- Owner is responsible for barking dog complaints, which may occur day or night.

**GREAT LAKES SHIPPING**

Ships from throughout the world can be seen sailing on the Great Lakes and in their major ports. Many of the ships are traveling to and from ports on the Lakes while others are making the 2,342 mile journey through the Great Lakes, the St. Lawrence Seaway, to Canadian and domestic ports and on to ports overseas. Most ships on the Great Lakes are owned by private companies, either American or Canadian. These ships can be distinguished by their hull colors and smoke stack markings.

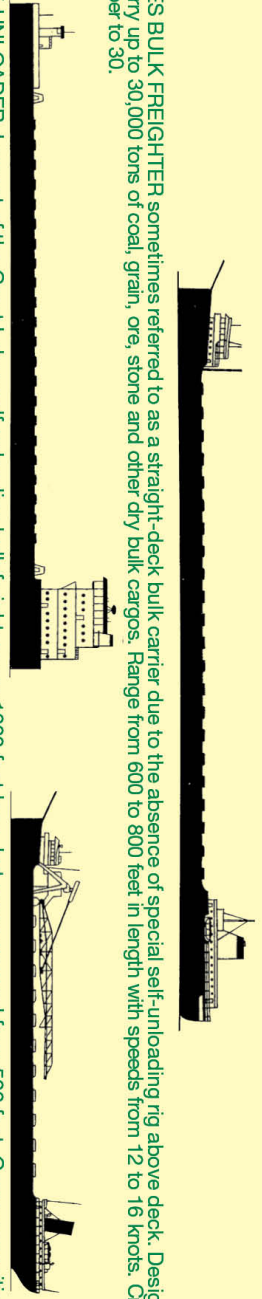
Ships registered in more than 60 countries visit Great Lakes ports annually. More than 800 ocean vessels transit the Great Lakes each season bound for American or Canadian harbors. Each of these vessels flies at the stern the ensign or national flag of the country in which it is registered. The largest ships which visit Great Lakes ports are designed to carry such bulk cargoes as iron ore, stone, and grain.

**OCEAN BULK FREIGHTER** carries bulk freight, usually grain, up to 1,000,000 bushels. These ships require shoreside equipment for loading and unloading. They measure from 500 feet to 730 feet in length and carry up to 40 crewmen. Speeds are 12 to 16 knots.

**OCEAN GENERAL CARGO VESSEL** has derricks and booms above deck which enables the ship to load and unload various general cargoes. Range from 500 feet to 730 feet long with carrying capacities of 20,000 tons. These vessels have speeds of 14 to 16 knots with a crew of 40.

**LAKE BULK FREIGHTER** sometimes referred to as a straight-deck bulk carrier due to the absence of special self-unloading rig above deck. Designed to carry up to 30,000 tons of coal, grain, ore, stone and other dry bulk cargoes. Range from 600 to 800 feet in length with speeds from 12 to 16 knots. Crews are about 250 feet long, so the 1000-footer becomes four boom lengths long while the 730-footer is about three.

**SELF-UNLOADER** Largest of the Great Lakes self-unloading bulk freighters are 1000 feet long, but range upward from 500 feet. Cargo capacities of the largest are in excess of 70,000 tons. Speeds are up to 15 knots and carries a crew of 30. From a distance it may not be easy to distinguish a vessel 1000 feet long from one 730 feet long. For self-loading vessels, the unloading boom can be used as a yardstick to estimate length. Most of these booms are about 250 feet long, so the 1000-footer becomes four boom lengths long while the 730-footer is about three.

**2026 Reservation Fees and Cancellation Policy**

**Reservation Fees**  
Credit Card Transaction & Reservation fee is \$8.00.  
The reservation fee is non-refundable.  
Payment in full is due at the time the reservation is made.  
Reservations by mail are no longer accepted.

**Cancellations**  
\$10,000 modification/cancellation fee is charged on all cancellations or modifications that result in a shortened stay.  
Cancellation notice must be given 5 days before the arrival date; check-in time to receive a partial refund of unused nights.

**Refunds**  
If cancelled or modified 5 days prior to reservation's arrival time, unused camp nights will be eligible for a partial refund as follows:  
• Refunds can only be processed 150 days (approximately 5 months) from the date of the original transaction; cancellations made after 150 days from booking are not eligible for a refund.  
• Minimum refund amount is \$15. Refunds calculated for less than \$15 will not be processed.  
• Cancellations with less than 5 day notice of unused nights will NOT be refunded.  
• Unused nights will be refunded less 25% cancellation charge, as long as notice is given 5 days prior to scheduled arrival time.  
• Reservations that are cancelled within 24 hours of the day they are created will only be assessed the \$1,000 cancellation fee.  
• Modifications to reservations that increase or do not affect the length of stay, will not be charged a modification fee.

**Late Arrivals**  
Reservations are held until 3:00 pm, two days after your scheduled arrival date. If arriving after 3:00 pm two days after your scheduled arrival date, you must notify the office to delay the arrival date or cancel the reservation. Failure to do so will result in a no-show and a loss of reservation charges.

Check in time is 3:00 pm  
Additional charges may apply for late check-out and early check-in.
