Overlooks - North Rim Trail (3/4 mile long, one way to the picnic area.)

- Inspiration Point (highest overlook at 900 feet) Grand Chasin, Oceana Falls and Pool below, suspension bridge above Hurricane Falls.
- 1. Grand Chasin (1,000 feet at highest point). Karl Wallenda walked from this tower point to south rim tower in 1970. Oceana Falls and Pool (50 feet) below, Bridal Veil Falls and Pool (17 feet) at far end of gorge view.
- 1a. View upper Hurricane Falls, suspension bridge above Hurricane Falls, and Devil's Pulpit.
- 2. L'Eau d'Or Falls (46 feet), Hawthorne Pool, Tempesta Falls (76 feet) and South Rim Trail.
- 3. L'Eau d'Or Falls (46 feet) and Hawthorne Pool. Wheelchair accessible from Interpretive Center.
- 4. Tallulah Dam - (completed in 1913 by Georgia Power Co.) and U.S. 441 bridge.

5. Upper gorge, Hawthorne Pool, overlooks 2 & 3. Wheelchair accessible from picnic area, benches available.

Overlooks - South Rim Trail (3/4 mile long, one way. Park at Interpretive Center or picnic area. Access via North Rim Trail.)

6. Hawthorne Pool, North Rim Trail overlooks, Tempesta waterfall (76 feet).
7. Tempesta Falls, Tempesta Pool and Hawthorne Pool.
8. Hurricane Falls and Pool (96 feet), Devil's Foot-bath (smaller pool and Devil's Pulpit (600-foot outcrop to the right).
9. Caledonia Cascade on north rim (600-foot drop). Wallenda's north tower and overlook directly across the gorge. Aerialist Karl Wallenda walked across Tallulah Gorge on July 18, 1970.
10. Oceana Falls and Pool (50 feet).

ParkPass - A parking fee is required and is valid for all parks visited that day. Proceeds go toward park maintenance. Frequent visitors can save money by purchasing an Annual ParkPass or membership in Friends of Georgia State Parks.

Campground Information

- At the time of registration, campers are required to pay for the total number of nights they will occupy the site.
- Visitors to registered campers are limited to six per campsite provided the campground is not full.
- Campsite occupancy is limited to 14 days.
- Check-out time is 12:00 p.m.
- A ParkPass is required for camping and may be purchased at the campground gatehouse upon arrival.
- Tents, truck campers, motorhomes, trailers, etc., must be placed on gravel camp pads or driveways. Please do not park on grass areas. Camping between designated sites is prohibited.
- Fires are allowed only on grill pads and must be attended at all times. Only dead trees or limbs on the ground may be collected for firewood.

Campsite Occupancy

- Campsite occupancy will be limited to one of the following vehicle combinations, and the camping party will consist of no more than six persons per site, with the payment of one fee.
 1. One motorhome and one automobile (or pickup).
 2. One auto with travel trailer and one auto.
 3. One pickup with mounted camping rig and one auto.
 4. One auto with pop-up tent trailer and one auto.
 5. Two motorized vehicles using one large tent or truck shell camper and auto in campground.
 6. Maximum of 2 tents per site.

General Information

- All motorized vehicles are subject to license and safety requirements and regulations of the Georgia Department of Public Safety.
- Parents are responsible for the actions and safety of their children.
- Unless otherwise posted, Camper Check-in is at Jane Hurt Yarn Interpretive Center.
- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in public use areas.**

Formerly known as the Shortline Trail, this system is approximately 3 miles long, involving a paved trail surface and sharing sections of Terrors Circle. The trail follows the cut of the Tallulah Falls Railroad as it winds along the scenic Tallulah Lake and river. Open to foot traffic, bicycles, etc.

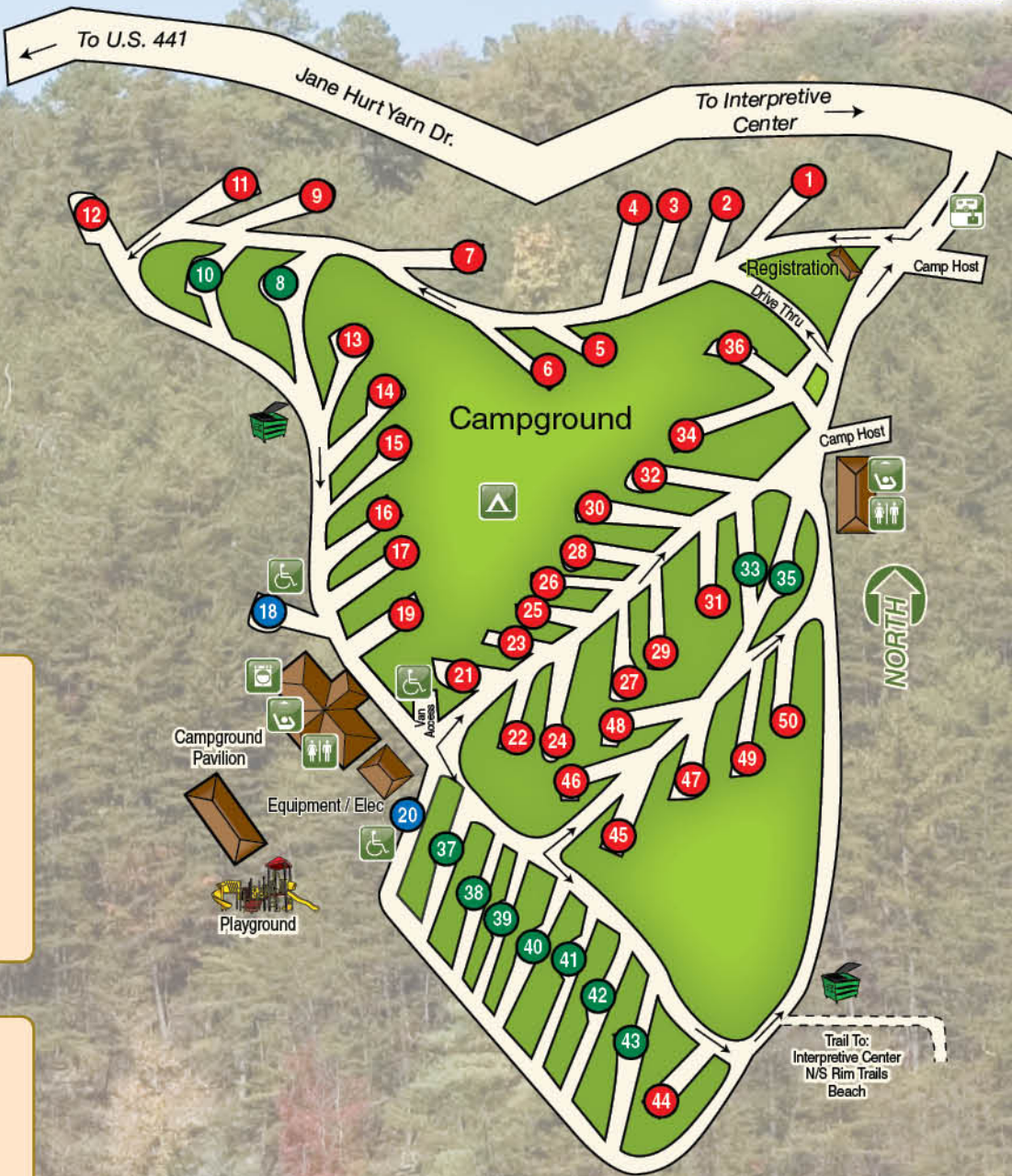
