

Park Rules and Information

- The park is open 8 a.m. until sunset daily.
- The campground features sites with 30 & 50 amps, water and sewer connections.
- Clothesline and tent ropes may not be tied to trees or plants.
- Campfires must be contained in grills.
- Do not collect downed firewood. Firewood may be purchased at park office.
- All camping equipment must be set up in your site. Do not put anything in the buffer zones.
- Please place all trash in the dumpster located in the camping area.
- Do not feed the wildlife, especially the squirrels.
- Do not leave food in your tent or it may be damaged by squirrels or raccoons

Recreational Activities

- Boat Ramp** - A boat ramp is located in the park. Canoes may be rented at Florida Caverns Gift Shop.
- Campfire Programs** - Campfire programs are offered seasonally. Checklists and other information available at the ranger station.
- Fishing** - Fishing for bass, bream, pickerel, catfish and speckled perch is good in the Chipola River. A Florida freshwater license may be required.
- Swimming** - Swimming permitted at the Blue Hole during daylight hours. No lifeguard on duty.
- Trails** - Equestrians, hikers and bicyclists enjoy more than 8 miles of trails. See a park ranger for details.
- Wheelchair Accessible** - The Florida Park Service is committed to providing equal access to all facilities and programs. Please contact the ranger station for assistance.

The caves at Florida Caverns State Park contain dazzling formations of stalactites, stalagmites, soda straws, columns, rimstones, flowstones and draperies. These fragile formations are composed of calcite, a mineral dissolved from limestone rock when surface water containing carbonic acid percolates through the rock into the caves.

Although the caverns are the focal point of the park, the 1,500-acre grounds also boasts a wide variety of plants, animals and other natural resources. American beech, southern magnolia, white oak and dogwood trees are prominent throughout the park, along with a number of plants that are also found in the southern Appalachian Mountains of North Georgia.

Protection

All plant and animal life is protected in state parks. Do not remove, deface, mutilate or molest these natural resources. For your safety, regulations prohibiting the feeding of animals are enforced. Please ask a Park Ranger for specific rules and information.

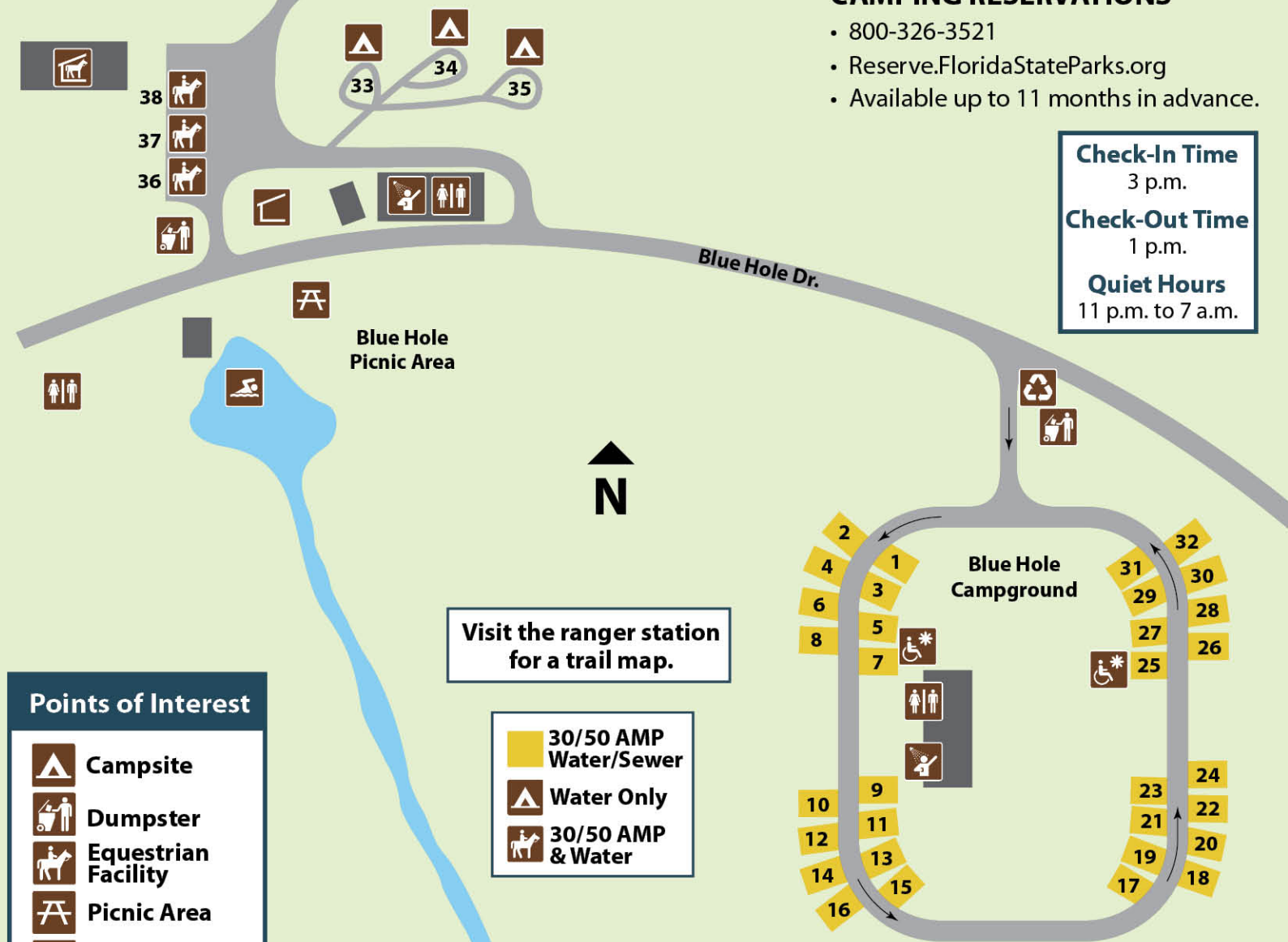
