

This historically significant park is the oldest and largest Woodland Indian site in the southeastern U.S., occupied by American Indians from 200 to 900 C.E. Georgia's oldest great temple mound, standing 56 feet high, dominates two smaller burial mounds and several ceremonial mounds. The park's museum is built around an excavated mound, providing an unusual setting for learning who these people

were and how they lived. Inside, visitors will find numerous artifacts and a film. Outdoor activities include camping, fishing, picnicking and boating. Hikers can choose from three scenic trails. The Spruce Pine Trail offers views of lakes Yohola and Kolomoki, while the Trillium Trail meanders through hardwoods and pines. The White Oak Trail is connected to the mounds and plaza area.

### Campground Information

**Hours:** Park closes at 10:00 p.m. and opens at 7:00 a.m. Visitors must leave the park by 10:00 p.m.

**Site Specific:** Campsites may be reserved ahead of time through Reserve America. Pre-booked sites will have a hang tag at the site showing their reservation.

**Trash:** All trash must be taken to the dumpster.

**Fires** are to be confined to fire rings only.

**Pets** must be kept on a six-foot leash and may not be left unattended in the park. Pets are not allowed in any park buildings.

**Dishwashing** is prohibited at drinking faucets or at comfort stations. Dump dishwater at designated locations throughout the campground.

**Quiet Hours** are 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. At that time, all noise from campers, TVs, radios and vehicles must be kept down.

**Campers Under 18** must be accompanied by an adult.

**Length of Stay** is limited to 14 days.

**Firewood Collection** is limited to fallen, dead timber. (Firewood for sale at Office.)

**Check-In** time is 1:00 p.m.; check-out time is 12:00 p.m.

Early Memorial Hospital provides the nearest medical/emergency services. From the park, go six miles to U.S. 27 S., turn right and go three miles into Blakely. Two blocks beyond courthouse square, turn right onto Hwy. 62 W. Go one mile to the hospital on left.

### Activities and Facilities

**Camping** — The park offers 24 tent and trailer campsites with water and electrical hook-ups, one group camp with dining room, and three pioneer camps. A comfort station offers hot showers and flush toilets for the regular campsites. There is also a sanitary disposal station located on the park.

**Group Camp** — A group camp, located next to the upper lake, comes complete with equipped dining hall, five cabins, infirmary, one craft shelter, play field, assembly shelter and is available for rent. The dining hall and chapel may be rented when the group camp is not occupied.

**Picnicking** — Numerous picnic tables and four picnic shelters are available throughout the park. Two large group shelters offer the capacity for 125 or 50 people. The picnic shelters may be reserved for a fee and are available on a first-come, first-served basis otherwise. Group shelters are available by reservation only. Please use trash receptacles throughout the park.

**Fishing** — Park waters are open for legal fishing throughout the year. Lake Yohola (upper lake) has a boat launch ramp. A fishing dock and boat launching area are provided at Lake Kolomoki (lower lake). Persons age 16 or older must have a valid resident/non-resident fishing license. Bank fishing is allowed from 7:00 a.m. until dark.

**Boating** — Private boats are permitted on park waters with a 10 horsepower restriction. Jon boats, canoes and pedal boats are available for rent at the lake. Boating is permitted until sundown. All boats must comply with the Georgia Boating Safety Law.

**Attractions** — The park facilities include nature trails, playground equipment, miniature golf, a museum and the mounds.
