

**ParkPass** - A parking fee is required at all state parks, and proceeds go toward park maintenance. Frequent visitors can save money with an Annual ParkPass. Join the *Friends of Georgia State Parks* and get a free Annual ParkPass. The daily ParkPass is valid at all state parks visited that day.

**Activities and Facilities**

**Camping** — Two campgrounds have 165 sites (84 on water) with electrical and water hookups. Ten walk-in tent sites have central water. Hot showers and dump stations are located throughout the campgrounds.

**Cottages** — 20 cottages (19 on the water) can be reserved up to 13 months in advance. All are two-bedroom with a capacity for eight people. Dogs are allowed only in select cottages with advance reservations.

**Picnicking** — A large picnic area with 121 tables, four shelters and two rest stations is available. The shelters may be reserved up to 13 months in advance. A 175-capacity group shelter and a 60-person capacity lakefront beach house are also reservable up to 13 months in advance.

**Fishing** — The lake affords fishing, boating, swimming, skiing and other water-oriented activities. There are four boat ramps in the camping areas. Hunting is not permitted in the park.

**Activities** — The park has an 18-hole mini-golf course, nature and hiking trails, beach, volleyball, horseshoes, basketball and memorial museum.

**Campground Rules**

All campers must register prior to occupying any campsite unless instructed otherwise by staff. Guests must be at least 18 years old to rent a site. Registration is required by 10:00 a.m. following late arrival. Check-out time is 12:00 p.m.

1. Tents are not permitted to be set up behind or between campsites. All equipment must be set-up on the gravel or tent pads.
2. Site occupancy limits are **strictly enforced**. If a campsite is deemed to be over occupied, you will be asked to remove vehicles, equipment and/or people. Campsite occupancy is limited to one immediate family or six persons per campsite. No doubling up on campsites. When the campground is full, no additional units are permitted. One of the following groups of camping rigs is allowed, provided the campsite will accommodate it:  
One (1) motorhome, fifth-wheel, travel trailer, pick-up truck with mounted camper or pop-up and one (1) tent. Two (2) tents may occupy one (1) site. Only one (1) additional vehicle is allowed.  
In addition to the above, one tent is authorized.  
One boat trailer per site is authorized, provided the site is large enough.
3. Campfires are to be built only in established fire pits and must be completely extinguished prior to retiring for the evening. Campfires should be attended to continuously.
4. Hang lanterns on provided posts. Do **NOT** drive nails, screws, pins, etc., into trees. Do not hang lights or lanterns in trees.
5. **Pets are allowed on a leash no longer than six feet.** Pets must be attended by their owners at all times or owners will be removed from the park.
6. Gray water must be dumped in the RV dump station. **No gray water may be dumped in the campsite or immediate area.**
7. No person under the age of 16 years shall operate or be a passenger on a bicycle unless he/she is wearing a helmet.
8. Roller skates, rollerblades, scooters, skateboards, hoverboards or similar devices are prohibited on park property.

All noise-making devices (TVs, radios, musical instruments) should be kept at very low levels so as not to disturb others.

Quiet hours begin at 10:00 p.m. No traffic permitted after 10:00 p.m. Park gates are locked at 10 p.m. All visitors must leave the park prior to 9:45 p.m., and all group gatherings must terminate by 9:45 p.m.

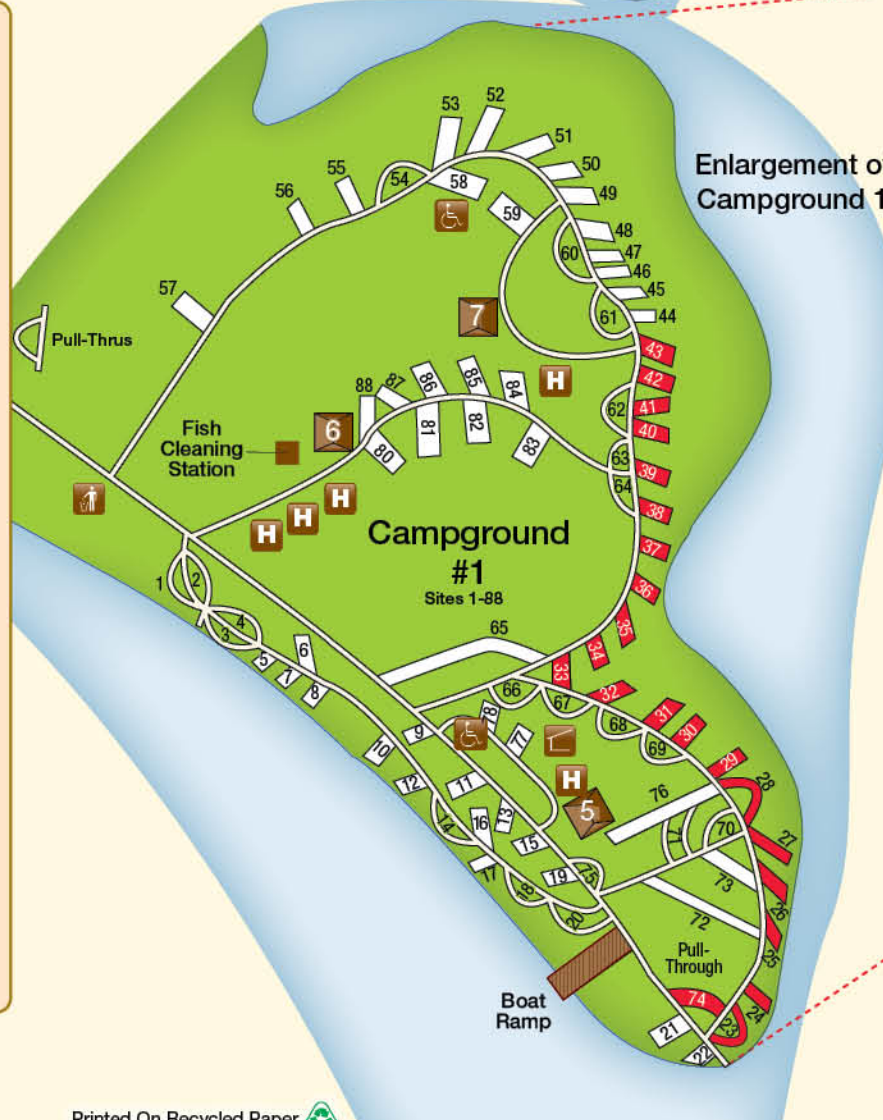
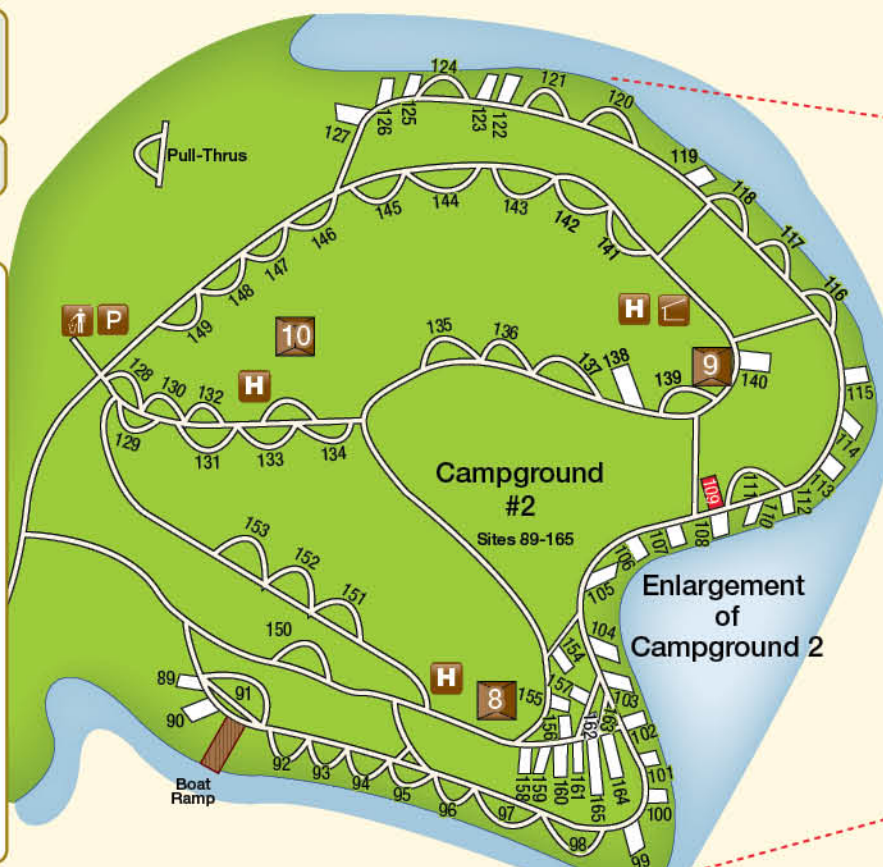

Located on the western shore of 71,100-acre Clarks Hill Lake, this park is named for a frontiersman and Georgia war hero who led pioneers during the Revolutionary War. A renovated and furnished log cabin museum displays furniture, utensils and tools circa 1780 and is open for weekend tours April through November. Visitors can also view the graves of Clark and his wife, Hannah. Anglers and boaters will especially enjoy the park's location on one of the largest reservoirs in the Southeast. Cottages are located on the lake's edge, and the spacious campground is nestled into the forest.
