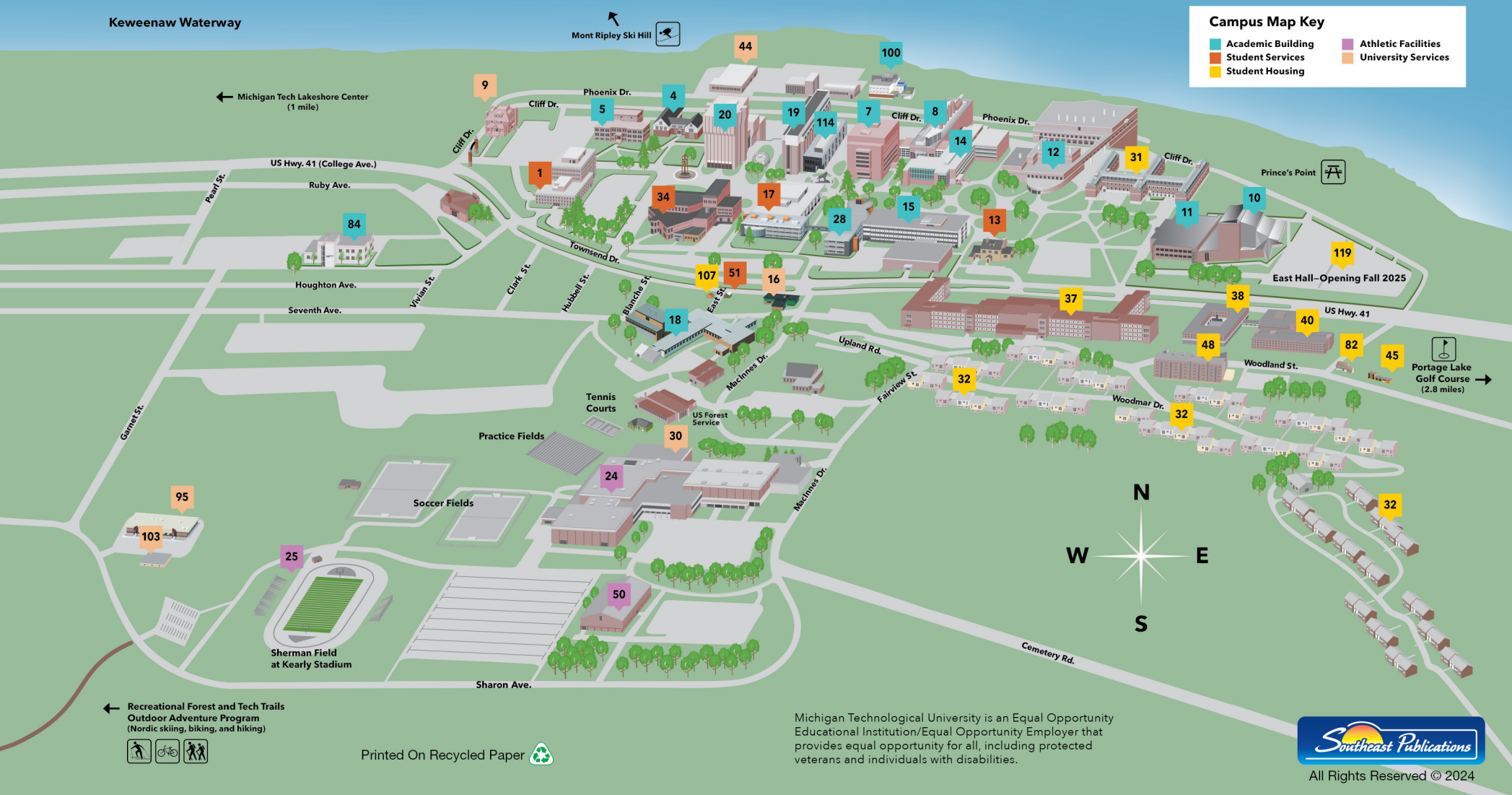

**Recreational Forest and Tech Trails**

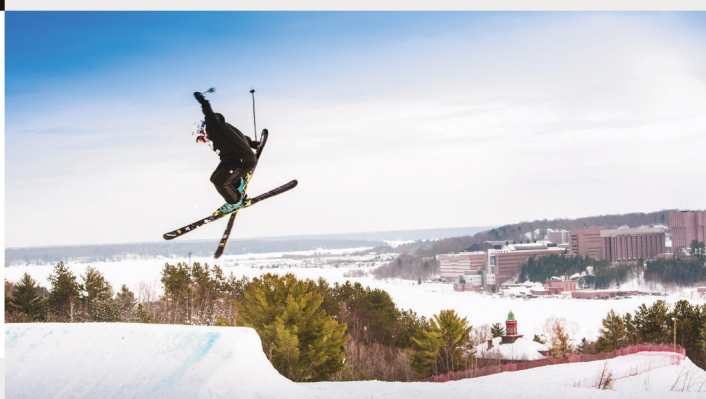

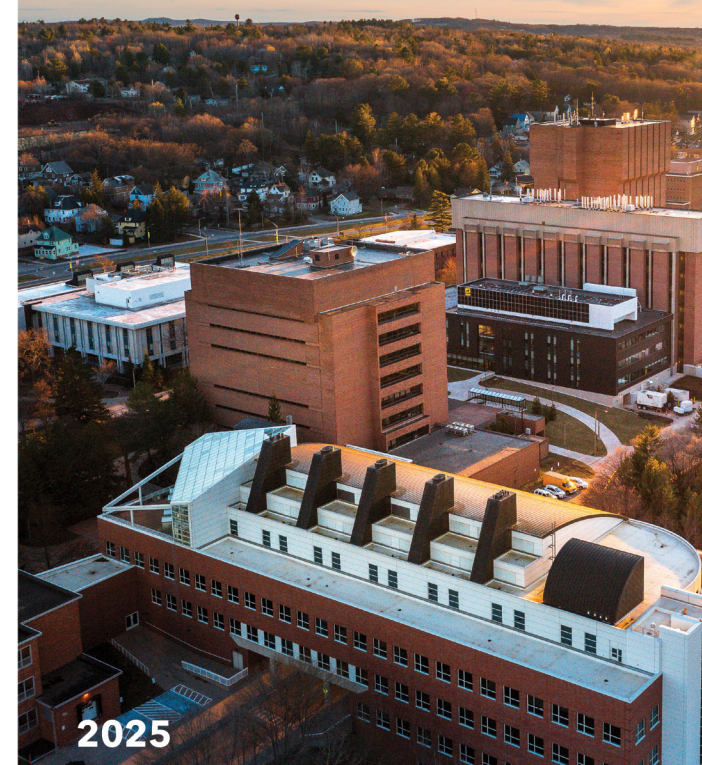
