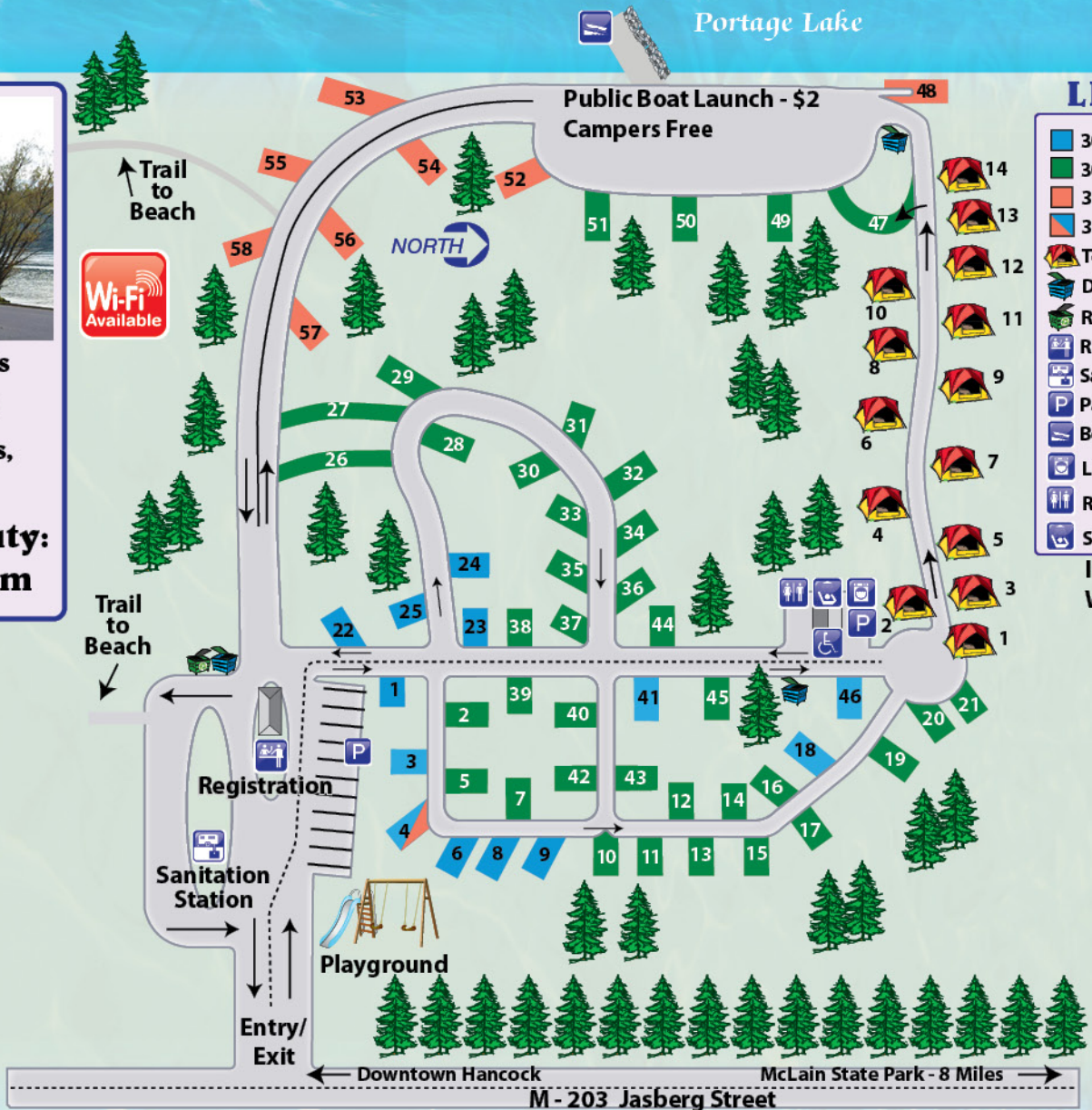

RULES & REGULATIONS WELCOME To The Hancock Campgrounds and Boat Launch Facility

Enjoy one of the Upper Peninsula's finest RV & Tent Campground with electric/ water, lake views, boat launch, and beach access. Amenities include showers/ restrooms/laundry/dump station/ice/firewood.

1. Camping is permitted only in established campgrounds.
2. Not more than one camp, occupied by a single family or group of **four** unrelated persons, will be permitted on an individual lot. No camp shall occupy more than one lot.
3. The senior responsible person of the party must register for the camp and occupy it for the first 24 hours. The permit will be revoked for any camp which is continuously vacant for longer than 24 hours.
4. Not more than two cars will be permitted per camp. Each car must be registered on the camp permit. Visitors must park in designated area.
5. Good campers are always considerate of others. Noise level **must** be controlled at all times so as not to disturb other campers.
6. Containers must be kept under drains and emptied at places designated by the park officer.
7. No dish washing will be allowed at drinking fountains, laundry rooms, or comfort stations.
8. Trenching on camp lots or cutting of trees in the park is not permitted.
9. Dogs must be under immediate control on a leash not exceeding six feet in length. No dogs allowed on bathing beaches or in buildings.
10. If sites are available, an extension to this permit may be obtained prior to 10:00 am on the day this permit expires. A campsite may be assigned to another camper if not extended by 10:00 am. Check-out time is 1:00 pm.
11. Prior approval of the park officer is required to move from one campsite to another.
12. A camp may be permitted not more than one table nor more than one electrical outlet, when available.
13. Visitors must leave campground by 10:00 pm.
14. Please provide your own plastic bags for your trash and garbage.

From May 15 through Oct 15, no camp may be established for more than fifteen consecutive nights in any one park or recreation area.

FACILITIES DESCRIPTION

- The Recreation Area comprises over 28 acres of developed properties offering opportunities for camping, boating, swimming, fishing and picnicking.
- Beach facilities include playground equipment, volleyball and horseshoe courts and many tables available for public enjoyment.
- Facilities include clean restrooms, showers, laundry, a changing house and boat ramp.
- All thoroughfares through the camping area are blacktopped and have streetlights for nighttime safety. In addition, all roads are police patrolled.
- There are daily fees for the campsites. Use of the beach is free.
- The Facility is open to the public from May 15 to October 15.
- Free Wi-Fi Internet access available.

CAMPING

- Enjoy camping in one of the Upper Peninsula's finest campgrounds.
- There are 72 campsites to choose from - 58 for recreational vehicles (with electric power) and 14 tent sites.
- The campsites are situated in a natural rustic setting among a densely wooded stand of conifers and various northern hardwoods and softwoods.
- The campground contains restrooms, shower facilities, ice, firewood and a laundry.
- An attendant is on duty from 8 am to 8 pm. Firewood is available for purchase from the attendant.
- Enjoy nature walks among the park's trails. There's good berry picking in season too.
- Ample parking is available.

BOATING

The park has over one mile of lakeshore frontage on beautiful Portage Lake, a 26 mile waterway of clean Lake Superior water unsurpassed for its natural beauty and multipurpose use.

SWIMMING

- Swim in the fresh, cool, clean water of Portage Lake or just sit and enjoy the 300 feet of beautiful sun-soaked sand beach.
- There's swimming, a pier, changing house, picnic pavilion and many tables available for public enjoyment.
