GUIDELINES

Due to the large increase in events, the users of H. Cooper Black Jr. Field Trial and Recreation Area are being asked to help with maintenance and conservation. All user groups are asked to rake leftover hay, manure and dog droppings into provided buckets—this includes open fields, primitive campsites, corrals and stalls. Also, you are required to make every effort to ensure your activity does not interfere with someone else's event. There is room for everyone!

CAMPING

- Dial 911 in an emergency.
- Check-in is at 2 p.m.
- Checkout is at 11 a.m.
- Horses are not to be on or near campsites.
- Hitching posts located in front of or behind campsites are to be used for securing horses.
- No tether lines allowed on campground—horses need to be in a stall or corral (except for the primitive campground).
- Only one horse allowed per stall/corral.
- Generators are allowed on primitive campsites as long as other campers are not disturbed.
- Campfires must be contained in fire rings and attended at all times.
- Individuals with two or more horses are responsible for any horses left behind.
- By law, all horses are required to have proof of a negative Coggins Test available for staff inspection.
- Dogs require proof of rabies vaccination and must be attended to at all times.
- Parking for trailers and vehicles is on site pad only. All other vehicles park in day-use area.
- Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- All trash must be deposited in the dumpster behind the clubhouse.

FACILITIES

- All Wildlife Management Area (WMA) regulations apply to the H. Cooper Black area.
- Any damage to the property including clubhouse, barn, bathhouse, corrals, campsites and dog kennels will be the financial responsibility of the user.
- All trash must be deposited in the dumpster behind the clubhouse.
- Pets are not allowed in the clubhouse kitchen area.
- No swimming permitted in ponds.

TRAILS

- Dogs are NOT allowed on the trails during the "Bird Dog" field trial events.
- All trail riders are REQUIRED to give field trial participants the right of way. ALL efforts should be made to allow the field trial to move forward with no interference—stop, wait and watch.
- No permit is required while riding within the boundaries of H. Cooper Black.
- Horses are required to stay on existing roads, designated horse trails or field trial courses.
- A maximum of four ATVs or RTVs may be used during an event. Only one person per ATV is allowed and RTVs may only be occupied by the number of people rated for.
- All activities will be posted on the website and on the bathhouse doors and kiosks—please be aware of other user groups in the camp.

BIRDS

- Pen-reared game birds may be released only during scheduled field trials. The field manager must supply the park with a field trial permit issued by the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources.

DOG TRAINING

- WMA Regulation 2.10 states: No person may release or attempt to release any animal onto WMA lands without approval of the department.
- WMA Regulation 2.10 regarding release: A person may use pen-reared birds for dog training on WMA lands only if the birds are shackled, confined or dead.
- The use of dead ducks for retriever training would not constitute hunting, therefore, a license is not required.
- Bird dog training can only take place during a field trial event (quail hunting is NOT allowed).
