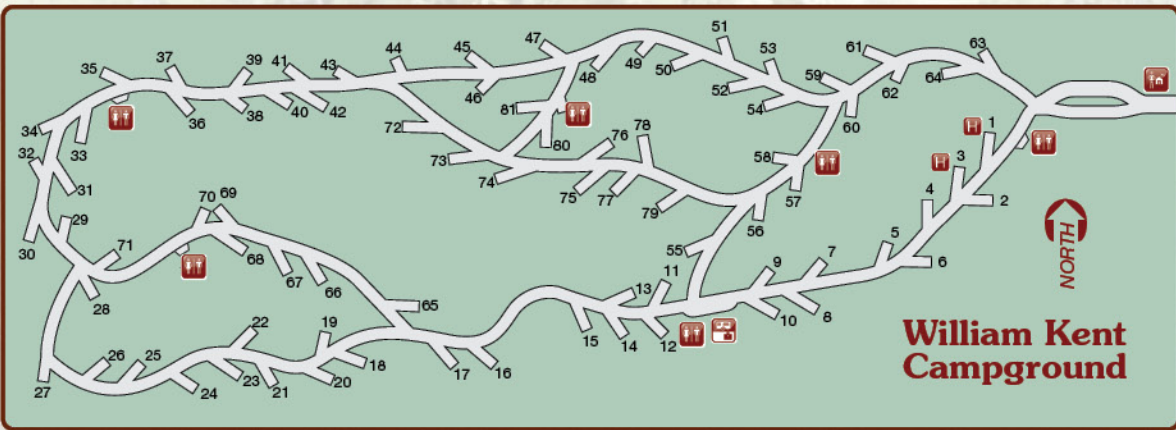


The West Shore

The West Shore Recreation Area is located at an elevation of 6,300 feet on National Forest land within the Lake Tahoe Basin. Facilities within these areas include the William Kent, Kaspian and Blackwood Canyon Campgrounds, all on Hwy. 89. William Kent has 81 sites and is two miles south of Tahoe City. Kaspian is a Handicapped Accessible Campground and picnic area. It also has a large beach area and public pier. Blackwood Canyon Campground has six overnight campsites that are first-come first-serve.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **CHECK-OUT TIME IS 12:00pm.**
- Please observe posted speeds.
- Quiet hours are from 10:00pm to 6:00am.
- Day Use Areas close at dusk.
- Maximum 14-day stay limit per year in the LTMU basin.
- PLEASE NOTE - Only third parties who have a contracted permit with the USFS may deliver and pick up RV's for visitors.
- Please do not move picnic tables.
- No off-road or non licensed vehicle use is permitted within the campgrounds or day use areas.
- Do not wash anything at water hydrants. All water must be used at your campsite.
- All campfires must be attended at all times and completely out upon your departure. Fires are only permitted in grills and rings provided.
- Please leave your site in a clean and neat condition.
- **BEARS FREQUENT OUR CAMPGROUNDS DAY AND NIGHT.** Please put all food in the bearproof lockers provided. Do not leave food in tent or sleeping area. DO NOT leave food or garbage inside of your car. Lock garbage dumpsters each time you use them. Always follow BEAR-AWARE rules that are posted throughout all campgrounds.
- Individual family campsites have a maximum limit of **SIX PEOPLE, and ONLY ONE RV PER SITE.**
- **PETS MUST BE ON A LEASH 6' OR LESS AT ALL TIMES IN CAMPGROUNDS. NO PETS ALLOWED ON SWIM BEACHES. LIMIT OF 2 PETS PER CAMPSITE.**
- **CAMPSITES COME WITH ONE CAR PASS. ALL OTHER VEHICLES MUST PAY AN ADDITIONAL FEE PER DAY FOR A CAR PASS.**
- All parked vehicles must be on the pavement of your own campsite. Parking in any other place will cause problems and could result in vehicles being towed at owner's expense. Parked vehicles CANNOT extend into the road!
- **QUIET HOURS 10:00pm - 6:00am.**
- **REPORT QUIET HOURS VIOLATIONS TO RESIDENT STAFF.**
- All camping guests are subject to day-use parking fees.

Featured campgrounds, day use areas and beaches are operated by Lake Tahoe Hospital, LCC, a professional park and recreation management company, under a Special Use Permit from the United States Forest Service.

Facilities within these areas include the 206-unit Fallen Leaf Campground plus Pope and Baldwin beaches and Bay View trailhead parking, all on Hwy. 89. Obtain additional information at the U.S. Forest Service Visitor Center on State Hwy. 89 near Fallen Leaf Campground.

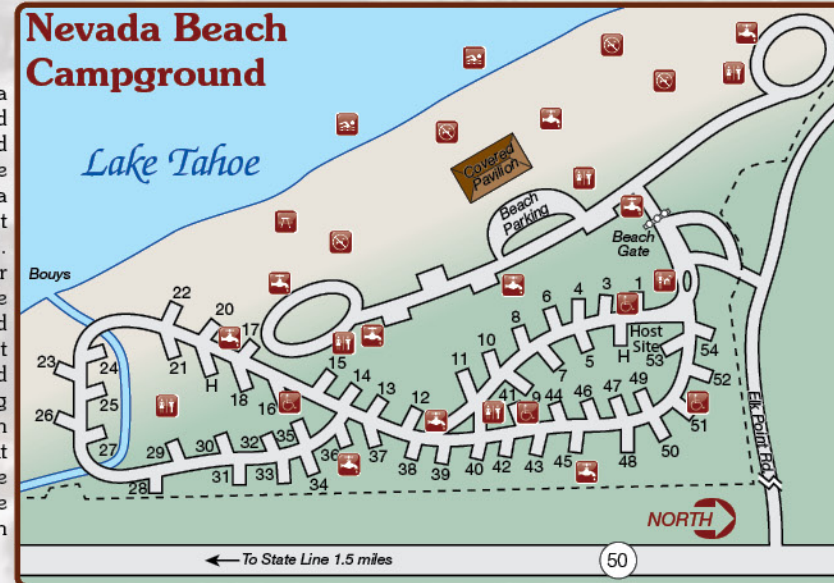

National Forest Lands Lake Tahoe Basin

The Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit lies within a unique Sierra Nevada geologic basin, along the border of California and Nevada. It encompasses over 150,000 acres of National Forest lands, and ranges in altitude above sea level from 6,225 feet at lake level to 10,881 feet at Freel Peak, overlooking the City of South Lake Tahoe. From sparkling lakeside beaches to high country alpine meadows and trails, the LTBMU provides some of the finest outdoor recreation in the nation, combined with breathtaking scenery. Whether you prefer the solitude of nature, camping, hiking, mountain biking, or water-sports, the LTBMU and its many basin partners provide some of the most diverse opportunities in all seasons of the year.

The East Shore

The 54-unit Nevada Beach Campground and Beach are located on Hwy. 50, one mile north of the Nevada state line on the east shore of Lake Tahoe. Information and visitor assistance are available at the campground offices from resident staff or from uniformed employees working within the area. Obtain additional information at the U.S. Forest Service Visitor Center on State Hwy. 89 near Fallen Leaf campground.
